

## Meetings with Belarusian ambassadors to the Nordic Countries September 2020

We speak on behalf of the Council of Nordic Trade Unions - NFS and our 15 member organisations which represents more than 8,5 million members including academics, white collar and blue-collar employees across all Nordic countries concerning the fraudulent conduct of the Belarus presidential elections. Among the affiliates, the Danish confederations FH and Akademikerne and the three Swedish organsiations LO Sweden, TCO and Saco.

Our demands and concerns concerning the serious and alarming situation in Belarus ahead and after of the Presidential election August 9 and the escalating violence and brutal force used and arrests of protesters, citizens and trade unionists fighting for democracy, decency, and human rights.

- Redo elections, where fair and democratic conditions with full transparency under international supervision is guaranteed. All valid stakeholders in the process needs to be recognised and binding agreements must be concluded.
- Respect and free room for maneuver for the free trade union movement in their fight for respect and trade union rights, as well as the freedom of the country. The independent unions of Belarus are the largest democratic and independent civil society movement.
- Release of all protesters, citizens and trade unionists expressing their freedom of speech
- Immediate and total end of all forms of violence against citizens, protestors, and trade unionists
- End suppression of communications, internet, and media
- Respect the freedom of the press
- Allow free movement of citizens throughout the country as well as cross borders
- Immediate adoption, respect and application of the ILO fundamental conventions ratified by the state of Belarus to protect Trade Unions, workers, and their right to collective action.
- Urgent ratification and implementation of other essential ILO's conventions to guarantee workers and their democratically elected representatives' full democratic rights in working life as well as freedom for a democratic development for the entire Belarus.
